Module 1: 17th-Century Deccan and the Emergence of Shivaji Maharaj (15 Hours)

- a) Socio-political landscape of the Deccan: Bijapur and Golconda Sultanates, Mughal expansion, Portuguese coastal presence, Siddhis of Janjira, and the role of local deshmukhs, watandars, and peasant communities
- b) Society, economy, and ecology: Agrarian relations, caste and occupational groups, mobility in the Maval–Sahyadri region, trade routes, forts, and the environmental setting shaping politics
- c) Emergence of Shivaji Maharaj: Family influences of Shahaji Raje and Rajmata Jijabai, early organization in the Maval, capture of key forts, mobilization of local support, and the initial articulation of Swarajya.

Module 2: Conflict of Shivaji Maharaj with Regional Powers and Rival Coastal (15 Hours)

- a) Struggles with the Deccan Sultanates: Engagements with Bijapur authority, Afzal Khan episode, and consolidation through control of forts and territory
- b) Confrontation with Mughal expansion: Shaista Khan campaign, sack of Surat, Treaty of Purandar, arrest at Agra and strategic recovery
- c) Rival coastal and regional powers: Conflicts with the Siddhis of Janjira, tensions with the Portuguese, and assertion of authority over local deshmukhs and chieftains.
